For the past 50 years, Camp Cosmos has been offering a safe space in Montreal for children of diverse backgrounds to learn, grow and play throughout the summer. 2022 was no exception. We were thrilled to run the first full capacity in-person camp after the pandemic at the beautiful Westmount Park United Church, welcoming 98 children including those with special needs. The campers visited countless parks, pools, beaches while enjoying programs carefully planned by coordinators from our environmental, intercultural, and athletics & well-being programs. Of special note is our refugee program which allowed us to register free of charge 28 Ukrainian children who had recently arrived in Montreal. Student Interns

This program provides front line experience to students from a wide variety of disciplines and MCM with valuable human resources.

MCM combines opportunities for practical experience with a pedagogical approach, providing a stimulating learning environment to a wide variety of students. In 2022, MCM once again benefited from a dynamic group of interns - 15 from 4 disciplines, representing 3 universities. Whether providing social work guidance, working on a case at the legal clinics, doing a home visit, presenting an online workshop or designing an evaluation process, MCM interns hone their skills as future professionals on a diverse interdisciplinary team.

Online Workshops

Refugee 101: Information on the refugee claimant process provided in two workshops by MCM supervising lawyer Rick Goldman and caseworker Peter Butler to Beaconsfield United Refugee Network and the Nakohnaka Regional Youth Network in the Eastern Townships.

Career Readiness/Mentorship: Sponsored by international firm Goodera for 25 members of MCM's newcomer youth network in Montreal and Toronto on: career journeys, interview prep, upskilling, tips on jobs & internships.

Ancient Texts/Contemporary Conversations: Exploration of hospitality in the Qu'ran with Muslim scholar Imad Balkis.

Language Classes: Weekly conversation sessions in French and English provided by Renaude Grégoire and Andrew Cutforth.

Projects

Gathering At Table Cookbook

Our first project bringing together local and newcomer seniors in 2022 was a resounding success. The Gathering at Table intercultural cook book that was launched in September at a Peace Day gathering, not only contains precious family recipes but, most importantly, the stories that are behind them.

Pledj (Promoting Leadership for Empowerment & Justice)

Together with this close community partner, we organized weekly employability training sessions for newcomers wishing to work in the nonprofit sector.

Holistic Reconciliation Within Newcomer Families

14 newcomer parents accompanied by a social worker met 10 times to share life experiences and get advice on understanding and integrating Canadian society.

Women Weaving their Dreams

WWD provides income to refugee women while allowing them to share their expertise and experience the support of a closely knit community. In 2022, 12 meals were catered by the women at both public and private events. *It's a heartwarming feeling to share our love for food with others and bring a taste of our culture to the wider community*, one woman said.

Apple Picking

This annual event continues to draw dozens of families for a day of fresh air, community and fun in the country. In 2022, 85 families representing over 200 individuals connected with old friends and made new ones. A special treat for the kids was the presence of Camp staff Josh and Fatou who amused young and old alike with their activities.

A visit to the 5 historic sites of St. James Methodist/United followed by lunch and discussion, allowed a diverse group to learn about the history of Montreal and the important role of St. James in building a just and inclusive society for all.

Just Solutions for vulnerable migrants

Message from the Clinic Coordinator

As coordinator of MCM's legal clinics for the past eight years, I am proud of the help, professional solutions and hope we have been able to provide to hundreds of vulnerable men, women and children. That work includes assisting female refugees who are victims of domestic violence - indeed the clinic has developed an expertise in this area - as well as parents and grand-parents seeking to reunite with their families. Our capacity to offer services in multiple languages, including Ukrainian and Russian, greatly facilitated our work in 2022 with refugees arriving from that war torn area of the globe, and will continue to do so in the months and years ahead. Joining with community coalitions to advocate for fair treatment of migrants, and improvement of government policies, is also an important part of weekly activities. A small dedicated and indefatigable team, along with student interns, accomplishes all of this and more - something that we can truly all be proud of! I would like to thank all of our supporters who make this work possible, with a special word of appreciation to BINAM (*Bureau d'intégration des nouveaux arrivants à Montréal*) whose partnership is essential to our ongoing mission of providing access to justice for vulnerable migrants.

CAR



The Committee to Aid Refugees (CAR) was established in 1984 as a project of the United Church of Canada. Over the past nearly 40 years, it has played an important role in collective advocacy and individual casework for refugees and other migrants with precarious status. CAR has also been involved in the supervision of the Just Solutions Legal Clinic since 2006.

However, the challenges of running a small stand-alone organization, along with the obvious complementary between the missions of CAR and MCM, led the two organizations to decide to join forces in an official manner. Throughout 2022, the boards of CAR and MCM met to discuss and then implement this important transition. At the start of 2023, MCM assumed all of CAR's activities as well as the employment of CAR's sole staff person, Peter Butler, who is now the MCM's Socio-legal Intervention Worker.
